Short description of the course

The aim of the course is to familiarise students with the basic principles, methods and techniques of research in applied linguistics, obtaining skills that are transferable to other fields of social sciences.

Full description of the course

The aim of the course is to familiarise students with the basic principles, methods and techniques of research in applied linguistics, obtaining skills that are transferable to other fields of social sciences. The course also provides introduction to basic statistical procedures used in the field of second language acquisition. In the first few lessons students get acquainted with basic notions of research and with basic research orientations in the field of applied linguistics (e.g. ethnomethodology, discourse analysis, action research). We then go on to discuss various research methods such as questionnaires, interviews, experiments, etc. The second half of the course introduces basic statistical analyses to the students, who also learn how to use the statistical programme SPSS at an elementary level.

Learning outcomes

At the end of the course, the learning will be able to conduct their own research project on master level and beyond, to critically evaluate research studies in applied linguistics and other social sciences, to analyse qualitative data using various techniques, to perform both descriptive and inferential statistical analyses.
